SELECTMEN'S MEETING
MINUTES
07/30/07

The meeting was opened at 7:00 pm.

MINUTES: The minutes of 7-23-07 were approved.

SELECTMEN'S ISSUES:

The board thanked Linda Whitcomb for taking care of the flower garden at the Town Office Building on Saturday.

At 7:15 **Frank & Louise Schartz** met with the board to discuss the maintenance of Prospect Hill Road. They have some concerns about the amount of sand on the road in front of there house and the use of calcium on it. The Schartz' explained that the town used to grade in the spring and then put down calcium by shovel and now a spreader is used which does not cover as well. The board understands their concerns and will talk to the road agent about this matter.

Junkyard information was reviewed and discussed by the board. The board agreed they need to have proper procedure in place before starting the licensing/enforcement process. The board will continue to review the information and will continue to work on this issue.

Beautification Week/Amnesty Day: The West Rumney Fire Station project is complete. Bruce Pollock donated 10 hours of labor to paint the fire station and many other volunteers also participated. Amnesty Day at the Transfer Station was a success.

Ambulance Write-Off Policy from the Town of Plymouth was reviewed. The town would like to know if they could be provided with the forms also in case residents contact the town office for forms.

Contractors/Bids – The board discussed the bid process. There are some contractors in town who would like to be involved in the bid process and feel the town does not adequately notify contractors when a job goes out to bid. Requests for bids are placed in the Record Citizen and posted locally. The board agreed to make a more conscientious effort to put the bid proposals out to the public.

ADMINISTRATION:

Solar Exemptions: Anne will review these on Wednesday with Mark Neider from CNP.

Blair/Darling Land Purchase – Still moving ahead slowly.

Skating Rink Update: The town received a check for the stumpage. Jim Heal will donate his time to stump the area.

Karen Joyce 16-04-26 – CNP will look at the property on Wednesday and it will be included as a pick-up for 2007.

Groton Hollow Road Complaint – A complaint was received from a Groton Hollow Road resident that someone had dug a ditch across the road. The Highway Dept. crew has already fixed the road.

National Flood Insurance Info: The board agreed to try and schedule a 30 minute meeting with a representative in the fall to discuss flood insurance.

Halewijn Driveway: Frank does not feel this driveway will impact the town road but would like to set up a time with Janice Mulherin to look at the driveway together. Janice will call Frank to set up a time.

Richard Gamache – Mr. Gamache of Quincy Road has asked to use the Quincy Ballfield on August 11, 2007 for a family reunion. Mr. Gamache has filled out the paperwork and paid the fee. He will also be contacting the Police Dept. about the need for coverage.

FEMA – The town has received \$33,500 for reimbursement. The reimbursement is only 75% of the eligible amount.

At 8:30 the board met with **Dan Quinn**. Mr. Quinn is interested in starting a residential rubbish disposal company in Rumney and he would like to know what the town would require. Mr. Quinn was given the commercial hauler regulations to review. The board explained the fee would be prorated for 2007 and the charge for the remainder of the year will be \$200.00. Mr. Quinn will have to provide a certificate of insurance, the signed permit and the \$200.00 fee before he can begin.
