SELECTMEN'S MEETING
MINUTES
September 23, 2013

Chairman Ed Haskell opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

TIMBER INTENT TO CUT: Lightfoot – Mr. & Mrs. Lightfoot appeared before the Board to explain their need for an intent to cut on their property located on Fox Run Lane. Cheryl Lewis recused herself. Mr. Lightfoot explained the RSA states you can cut up to 10,000 board feet before filing the intent to cut. His cut can go up to 14,000 feet with most of this already cut. He is not doing a clear cut. His intentions are to put in a new septic system and replace the present cabin with a two (2) bedroom cabin. Their retirement plans are to spend six months here and six months in a warmer climate.

Ed questioned if his logger was a professional forester. Mr. Lightfoot explained he is not a professional forester – has done landscaping and logging over the years. The intent was signed by Ed Haskell and Dan Kimble. Copies were provided to Mr. Lightfoot. Cheryl rejoined the Board at this time.

EXCAVATION REVIEW: Questions regarding adding blasting regulations to the excavation regulations had been sent to Atty. Waugh. No response has been received at this time.

FIRE DEPARTMENT BY-LAWS: C. Lewis questioned if the new by-laws for the fire department had been sent to the attorney and if there had been any response. Again, there has been no response from the attorney.

NON-PUBLIC SESSION: At 7:35 pm Dan Kimble made a motion to enter into non-public session per RSA 91-A:3 II (a), seconded by Cheryl Lewis with a 3-0 vote. Discussion took place with no decisions made. Dan made a motion at 8:30 pm to come out of non-public session, seconded by Ed Haskell with a 3-0 vote.

TRANSFER STATION: Sonny Ouellette provided three estimates to purchase a brush cutter for the transfer station. Discussion led to questioning the need for two units as the highway department had purchased a brush cutter this year. Cheryl stated she would talk to Sonny about this.

The purchase was tabled at this time.

Dan reported the school presently has 50-100 folding chairs available if the town wants them back. The chairs were originally provided by the town for use at meetings.

The meeting adjourned at 9 p .m.
